SISTER SHARON FALCONER

REAL

SISTER MARIA BUELAH WOODWORTH-ETTER

(July 22, 1844–September 16, 1924) an American healing evangelist. Her ministry style was a model for Pentecostalism.

REAL

WILLIAM FRANKLIN GRAHAM JR.

a prominent American evangelical Christian figure and an ordained Southern Baptist minister who became well known internationally in the late 1940s.

WILLIAM ASHLEY SUNDAY

(November 19, 1862 – November 6, 1935) a popular American outfielder in baseball's National League who became a celebrated and influential American evangelist during the 20th century.

(1890–1944), Pentecostal preacher and founder of Foursquare Church

(31 March 1860 – 4 August 1947) a British evangelist who conducted evangelistic campaigns in the United States and Great Britain.

REAL

DWIGHT LYMAN MOODY

(February 5, 1837 – December 22, 1899), AKA D. L. Moody, an American evangelist and publisher connected with the Holiness Movement, founded the Moody Church, Northfield School and Mount Hermon School in Massachusetts.

HENRY ALLEN "HARRY" IRONSIDE

(October 14, 1876 – January 15, 1951) a Canadian-American Bible teacher, preacher, theologian, pastor, and author who pastored Moody Church in Chicago

EVAN JOHN ROBERTS

(8 June 1878 – 29 January 1951), was an Evangelist and leading figure of the 1904–1905 Welsh Revival

(1938-2006) founded a church, Zola Levitt Ministries, in Dallas, Texas
